Prof. Anatoly Moiseevich Vershik is an eminent Russian Mathematician. He is a Professor of the Chair of Mathematical Analysis, Department of Mathematics and Mechanics, St. Petersburg State University. Prof. Vershik is also the Head of the Laboratory of Representation Theory and Dynamical systems, St. Petersburg Department of Steklov Institute of Mathematics of the Russian Academy of Sciences. He is best known for his work on the representation of infinite symmetric groups and applications to the longest increasing subsequences.
